Announcement of Intent to Fill Board Vacancy and Application Information From the Salinas City Elementary School District

Applications are requested from community members to fill the Board seat vacated by the resignation of Francisco Javier Estrada, whose term expires November 2024.

Applicants must have the following qualifications:

- They must be 18 years of age or older;
- They must reside within Trustee Area 2 of the Salinas City Elementary School District;
- They must be a registered voter.

The application process includes completing the application for appointment and submitting a brief resume of the applicant's background and a statement explaining why the applicant is interested in becoming a member of the Salinas City Elementary School District Board of Trustees. The application can be obtained from the Office of the Superintendent, located at 840 S. Main St., Salinas, between the hours of 8am-4:30pm.

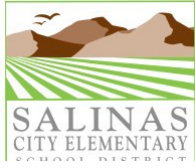

Applicants who submit completed applications will be contacted by Debbie Harris and will undergo a public interview process at a scheduled board meeting.
